





Penalties as each House may provide. Each House may determine the Rules of its Proceedings for its Members for disorderly Behaviour, and, with the Concurrence of two thirds, expel a Member. Each House shall keep a Journal of its Proceedings, and from time to time publish the same, excepting such Parts as may in their Judgment require Secrecy; and the Yeas and Nays of the Members of either House on any question shall, at the Desire of one fifth of those Present, be entered on the Journal. Neither House shall adjourn on any Day, but such Number of Days as they shall determine, except on the Day of their adjournment, unless they shall be adjourned on that Day by the Senate or the House of Representatives, in which Case they shall adjourn on the next Day.
